INTRODUCTION.

Every year Youth and Women Empowerment(YAWE) Foundation in conjuction with Kabarole Unique Stars Association(KUSA) organizes an annual residential youths conference of young people living with HIV in Kabarole District. The purpose of this conference is to strengthen the network of young people living with HIV,share knowledge and experience to address their challenges. In addition it provides the youths with an opportunity to actively participate in World AIDS day commerations that is always on 1st of December. This year a total number of 201 youths attended the conference at Servant King Center from 28th November to 2nd December and each day had it's own special program that went as follows;

On 28/11/2015, it was arrival day as vouths came from their respective homes in big numbers and gathered themselves at our four agreed collection stations of Buhinga, Kabarole, Virika HIV Clinics and YAWE Center. On the same day there was hiring of mattresses to the conference place for the youths to sleep on during the night and later the driver started picking the youths from

the collection points to the conference place an exercise that went on till 6:30pm. We had evening tea, orientation of the conference place and supper was served at 7:40pm. Mr. George the Director(YAWE) gave warm welcoming remarks, there was self introduction, sharing conference expectations, asking questions and bed time. On **29/11/2015**, being a Sunday our program began as early as 6:00am with personal management,7:30am we had breakfast and 8:30 we had a spiritual input from Servant King Center manager up 10:00am, a discussion on life skills led by Mrs. Mabiiho, Winfred,Mr.Gabriel and Miss Doreen started involving asking questions and finding possible answers up 1:00pm lunch break. At 2:00pm Mrs. Mugarra Francis held a discussion on basic components of positive living up 4:30pm when the Honorable Member of Parliament Alex Ruhunda arrived and did the official opening of the 5 days residential annual youth conference. Honorable Alex Ruhunda expressed his heartfelt gratitude on seeing youths living with HIV together for a common good. He greatly appreciated the idea of starting a bakery project and even predicted it's future success.

On **30/11/2015** Mrs. Nyakaana Jennifer,Mr.Rwabakama Moses and Mr. Richard occupied the morning hours from 8:30am to 1:00pm in a discussion on Relationship matters among young people living with HIV/AIDS. In the afternoon we all went to attend the candle light event at Public library in Fort Portal town where YAWE brass band led the matching exercise around town several speeches from Religious leaders, acting District Health Officer(D.H.O) Dr. Nathan, the guest of honor LCV Chairperson Honorable Richard Rwabuhinga who expressed his deep concerns about the high prevalence in the district at 11.3% almost doubling the national figure which is at 7.3%. He went a head to emphasize much on the HIV prevention interventions of Safe Male Circumcision(SMC),Condom Promotion, elimination of mother to child transmission.







On 01/12/2015 it was World AIDS day. All youths looked smart in their green tshirts which was a contribution from Inka's family support. We all went to the World AIDS day ceremony and our presence was highly recognized and felt by the public. Kasabiiti Christine our Unique Star member gave a testimony on positive living which touched the lives of many at the ceremony. The acting District Health Officer(DHO)Dr. Nathan extended his deep appreciation for the great work YAWE is doing to cause positive change in the lives of young people living with HIV/AIDS. YAWE brass band took the playing the National, East Africa and Tooro Kingdom Anthems as soon as the Guest of Honor arrived. YAWE drama club gave a welcoming cultural dance song that made the ceremony more lively. The District LCV chairperson Kabarole Honorable Rwabuhinga Richard also praised the good work YAWE does to reachout communities for HIV Counseling and Testing, Cancer Screenig. The Guest of Honor Minister Local Government Honorable Adolf Mwesige expressed the need for more efforts in the fight against

HIV/AIDS and promised to work with the district health implementing partners like YAWE in extending services further more in the hard to reach areas.

On 02/12/2015 was our last day of the conference and a number of invited guest speakers began arriving at 10:00am to officiate the closure. Among these was the Kabarole District HIV/AIDS focal person Mr. Nyakaana Patrick who praised the initiative of coming together every year for knowledge sharing. The District Health Educater(DHE) Madam Catherine also expressed her gratitude to the Director Mr. Akora George for his endless efforts to keep a helping hand on the young people living with HIV/AIDS. Finally the Guest of honor arrived Honorable Alex Ruhunda area Member of Parliament Fort Portal Municipality

come despite of his busy schedule. The honorable sliced the cake which was shared among all of us. After we enjoyed our big lunch later departure at 3:00pm.

- Taking an initiative of Savings and Credit programs.
- Strengthening our network further more in partnering with interested Organizations.
